
PRESIDENTS CORNER

I recently saw a post on FACEBOOK that read “If we don’t teach our children to follow Christ, the world will teach them not to.” (Thank you Nancy Mandeville!)

How true this is! Parents have the major role in helping their children develop a lasting faith – especially dads!

A Swiss study done in 1994 showed that fathers have a stronger influence on having their offspring be church goers in their adult lives, than even their moms. Here are some excerpts from the article:

The question was asked to determine whether a person’s religion carried through to the next generation, and if so, why, or if not, why not. The result is dynamite.



- There is one critical factor. It is overwhelming, and it is this: It is the religious practice of the father of the family that, above all, determines the future attendance at or absence from church of the children.
- If both father and mother attend regularly, 33 percent of their children will end up as regular churchgoers, and 41 percent will end up attending irregularly. Only a quarter of their children will end up not practicing at all.

- If the father is irregular and mother regular, only 3 percent of the children will subsequently become regulars themselves, while a further 59 percent will become irregulars. Thirty-eight percent will be lost.
- If the father is non-practicing and mother regular, only 2 percent of children will become regular worshippers, and 37 percent will attend irregularly. Over 60 percent of their children will be lost completely to the church.
- Where neither parent practices, to nobody's very great surprise, only 4 percent of children will become regular attenders and 15 percent irregulars. Eighty percent will be lost to the faith.

The article also looks at the figures the other way round. What happens if the father is regular but the mother irregular or non-practicing? I refer you to this link to see some rather extraordinary results!

Though these figures were not available in the late 1940's when Cursillo (the forerunner of Tres Dias) was formed, it seems that the early founders were aware of the importance of men in the church. They realized that to revitalize the church it was necessary to bring men back into the activities of the church.

So this message is for men, especially young fathers! Take your role as spiritual head of the household to heart, and take your children to church regularly!

Judy and I take part on a Human Rights Committee for where we used to work. Some of the clients I used to work with also take part on this committee. After the meeting I was talking with one of my former clients and he said that he wished that I was still working with him at his facility and that he missed me. I had retired 10 and a 1/2 years ago. I know that when I go to visit the people I used to work with where I used to work, I am greeted with hugs and they catch up on what they have been doing in their lives. Back when I had become a Case Manager, I had individuals only with Developmental Disabilities on my caseload. I was told that I would have to split my caseload and have 1/2 individuals with Developmental Disability and 1/2 individuals with Mental Health issues. One of the things that happened was that the people I had to drop off my caseload, kept on coming back to me with problems that they had to have solved. I would try to tell them that they were no longer on my caseload but I would help them. You see I had earned their trust. Sometimes trust is not freely given but once given is well kept. It can be truly amazing how Christ can work in your's and other's live's. What is your ministry?
